Construction Permit Requirements in North Dakota

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All septic systems in North Dakota must conform with provisions contained in chapter 16 of the state plumbing code. This chapter outlines basic requirements regarding design, siting and construction materials.

Local health units may develop their own set of rules and regulations regarding septic systems, but these rules must meet the minimum requirements outlined in the state plumbing code. However, local units can adapt some requirements that are more stringent than the state plumbing code.

Local health units **with** environmental health services assume responsibility for enforcement of the septic system codes, whether they are local rules or the state code. Local health units **without** environmental health

services available and counties with no health unit must have septic system complaints and code violations inspected by either the North Dakota Department of Health or an inspector hired on contract. Many counties contract with a local health unit with sanitarians for inspections. However, not all local health units with qualified inspectors participate in providing this service.


At the county level, it is sometimes difficult to find the rules and requirements for septic systems and whether they are administered locally. Some counties belong to health districts that have their own set of septic system rules and regulations and some do not. Some health districts have personnel that do onsite inspections for septic systems and some do not. Some health districts require permits for installation, licenses for septic system installers, and inspections before closure during construction and some do not. The differences across the state can be very confusing, thus the purpose of this circular.



There are five types of local health units in North Dakota. There are multi-county health districts, single county health districts, a city-county health district partnership, a city-county health department, and single county health departments. There is a difference between a health district and a health department. Health districts are governed by a local health board with tax levy

authority. It is separate from the county commission board and has its own budget. A county health department reports to the county commission and its budget is part of the county budget. The geographic boundaries of the local health units in North Dakota are shown in figure 1. The septic system requirements for each health unit are in table 1.

Figure 1. Local Public Health Departments




