H. D. Long and Max Waldron have started a co-operative truck farm somewhere in the vicinity of the poor house, a rather unique coincidence it seems.

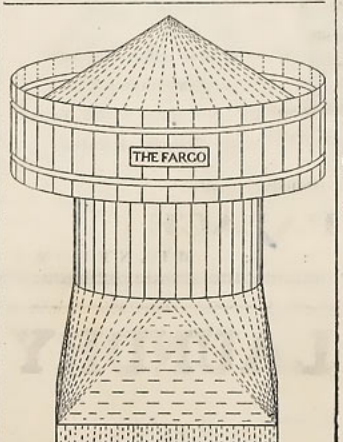
The interclass baseball schedule is now posted on the bulletin board of the main building. Lack of space forbids its appearance in this issue.
