BIOGRAPHY

Herb Poppke was born on March 19, 1921 in Goodrich, North Dakota. He was born to parents Theodore and Katharina (Felchle) Poppke, who had thirteen children, ten of which survived. Theodore Poppke (1887-1962) was a German Russian immigrant who came to the United States in 1910. Katharina Felchle (1891-1932) was also a German Russian immigrant who came to the United States in 1894.

The Poppke family moved around some in North Dakota, until settling in Tuttle, where Herb graduated high school in 1939. He then attended Valley City State College, and he later served a few years in the Army.

After the service, Herb worked at a number of jobs, and he later took courses from the University of Louisville. He graduated in 1951 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. After graduation, he worked as an engineer for a number of companies, one of which was the Coors Brewing Company. Herb retired from there in 1982.

Herb Poppke married Loraine Hardy on April 26, 1946 in Louisville, Kentucky. The couple later divorced in 1980.

Herb was always an advocate in preserving, researching, and sharing the culture and history of the Germans from Russia. He was actively involved in researching and writing about German Russian history and genealogy, and he belonged to many organizations.

Herb Poppke died on August 15, 2012, at the age of ninety-one.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The **Herb Poppke Collection** is an extensive collection consisting of correspondence, research, maps, photographs, publications, organization materials, electronic media, and other various items related to the Germans from Russia, spanning the many years of Poppke's research and collecting career.

Herb Poppke was an avid writer, researcher, and collector, especially of maps and books. Herb was the author of many papers and letters. He was very vocal on his thoughts and opinions and shared them often with friends and colleagues. He also collected a large volume of books relating to the Germans from Russia, many of which are housed in the GRHC library.

The collection's organization is heavily centered on the order that was already established when the collection was donated to the GRHC. Herb had his own filing system and organization, and he often drafted indexes to go along with his materials. The Herb Poppke Collection is comprised of twenty series: Poppke, Correspondence, Newsletter, Organizations, Convention, Map, Research, Publication, Photo Journal, Magazine, Newspaper, Wandering Volhynians, Folklore, Genealogy, Food, Photograph, Copies of Selected Materials, Music, Audio Tape, and Subject.

The [Poppke Series](#) includes materials written by Herb Poppke or materials personally relating to him and his family. The series has been divided into two sub-series:

The [Writings Sub-Series](#) contains materials written by Poppke, including papers and his thoughts on various topics.

The [Poppke/Felchle Family History Sub-Series](#) consists of family history information on the Poppke and Felchle families, including a genealogy binder and copies of census records from 1910 to 1930.

The [Correspondence Series](#) is one of the largest in the collection, spanning from 1973 to 2005. It includes both incoming and outgoing correspondence. The series has been arranged into three sub-series:

The [Personal Correspondence Sub-Series](#) includes correspondence to and from individuals. Herb corresponded with many people over the years, and the topic of the letters often varies. The contents might include research information, conventions, articles, and everyday things. The sub-series has been organized by the individuals Poppke was corresponding with, and they have been placed in alphabetical order, according to their last names.

The [Organization Correspondence Sub-Series](#) contains letters to and from organizations. Poppke was actively involved in many organizations, and he would often correspond with members and top officials of the organization. The contents mainly include Poppke writing to organizations for research purposes, voicing his opinions on certain matters, or upcoming and past conventions.

The [Subject Correspondence Sub-Series](#) includes correspondence to and from various people relating to certain topics. The sub-series is organized by the subject and content of the letters. It has been arranged alphabetically.

The [Newsletter Series](#) is one of the smaller series in the collection. It is comprised of newsletters from different organizations that Poppke collected over the years, spanning from 1979 to 2004.

The [Organization Series](#) consists of materials collected by Poppke from the many organizations he was associated with. The series has been organized alphabetically and spans from 1974 to 2004. The content of the series includes bibliographies, petitions, membership rosters, flyers, brochures, and other materials created by the organization.

The [Convention Series](#) contains information, itineraries, booklets, and other things relating to certain organization conventions that Poppke attended, spanning from 1972 to 2005. As Poppke was very active in many organizations, he would often attend the annual conventions. The series is organized alphabetically and then chronologically.

The largest series in the collection is the [Map Series](#). Poppke was well known for researching and collecting maps. His map collection includes hundreds of specialized maps including maps of Russia, Ukraine, Poland, and some of the United States. Some maps are general and broad, spanning across countries, while many others are very specific regions. The maps are in English, German, and Russian. Most of the maps also have a corresponding folder that goes along with it. The folders contain Poppke's notes or even photocopies of a particular section of the actual map. Not all maps have folders, but the majority of them do. In some cases, there is a folder but no map.

The organization of the map series follows the order and numbering system established by Poppke. Specific numbers were assigned to specific maps. Different versions of a map, such as enlarged or reduced maps, would have their own numbers. In some instances, there is more than one copy of map. There are also some gaps in Poppke's number system. In some cases, there are no maps or files for a particular number. The maps are listed below by their A, P, or U numbers, and the region on the map is also listed. Also included is if there is a map, file, or both. The series has been arranged into four sub-series:

The [A Maps Sub-Series](#) contains the "A" maps, which are the AHSGR and Stumpp maps. The A maps include: A01-A03, A05-A18, A21-A30, and A43. Then the numbers jump to: A601-A610. There is no file or map for the following: A04, A19, A20, A31-A42, A44-A60, and A600.

The [P Maps Sub-Series](#) contains the "P" maps, which is Poppke's grouping for the other maps. The bulk of the map series is in this sub-series. There is no file or map for the following: P334, P394, P400, P441-P443, P451-P485, P501-P505, P507-P511, P513-P536, P553-P555, P560-P571, P574-P577, P580-P586, P594, P601-P636, P640, and P647-P698.

The [U Maps Sub-Series](#) is comprised of the maps that were not filed by Poppke. The "U" maps were maps in Poppke's collection without an assigned number ("A" or "P" numbers). Poppke wrote on these maps "not filed" or "unfiled." As a result, these maps have become known as the "U" maps and their numbers have been assigned by staff.

The [Map Notes Sub-Series](#) consists of files on certain regions. The files include coordinates, notes written by Poppke, and copies of select maps. The sub-series has been arranged alphabetically, mainly by the region.

The [Research Series](#) has information on colonies, people, and towns. Poppke was always active in researching various topics on the Germans from Russia, including his own family. He also researched miscellaneous topics. The series has been divided into three sub-series:

The [Research Binders Sub-Series](#) includes research topics and information that was organized and placed into binders by Poppke. The sub-series is arranged in alphabetical order.

The [Research Folders Sub-Series](#) contains information on towns, colonies, and other topics that was organized into folders by Poppke. The sub-series is arranged in alphabetical order.

The [Land Expropriation Sub-Series](#) includes information from various sources on land expropriation in 1915 and 1916. Poppke collected research and notes on land expropriation for different towns and individuals. There is even a copy of a Russian newspaper from 1916 listing people who were evicted. The sub-series is in alphabetical order.

The [Publications Series](#) consists of booklets, periodicals, journals, and books. The series has materials published by organizations that Poppke belonged to as well as materials from the United States government. The series has been divided into two sub-series:

The [Booklet and Journal Sub-Series](#) is mainly comprised of bibliographies, journals, and booklets published by Germans from Russia organizations. The sub-series is in alphabetical order.

The [USSR Sub-Series](#) has books that were published in the early 1970s relating to the U.S.S.R. The sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

In the fall of 1993, Herb Poppke took a thirty-two day trip to the Ukraine, visiting four areas: Glückstal, Shitomir, Teplitz, and Grossliebental. He traveled with a car, driver, and a translator. After his trip, he compiled a photo album for each area. These four binders have been organized into the [Photo Journal Series](#).

The [Magazine Series](#) contains ten magazines. One is an edition of *Life* from 1990, and the other nine are editions of *Soviet Life* from the early 1980s. The series is arranged in alphabetical order, based on the title of the magazine, and then chronologically.

The [Newspaper Series](#) consists of twenty-nine newspaper editions from six different newspaper publishers, spanning from 1974 to 2004, and clippings from a variety of papers. The newspapers are in English, German, and Russian. The series has been arranged into seven sub-series:

The [McClusky Gazette Sub-Series](#) has six editions of the *McClusky Gazette*, all from 2004. The *McClusky Gazette* is published in McClusky, North Dakota. The sub-series is in chronological order.

The [Rocky Mountain Herald Sub-Series](#) has two editions of the *Rocky Mountain Herald*, both of which have unknown dates.

The [Bismarck Tribune Sub-Series](#) has four editions of the *Bismarck Tribune*. One edition is from 1982, and the other three are from 1997 and are only certain sections of the newspaper.

The [Denver Post Sub-Series](#) has ten editions of the *Denver Post*. All of the editions are from May 1974. They are parts 1-10 of the Nixon Transcripts.

The [Record Sub-Series](#) has two editions of *The Record*, both of which have unknown dates.

The [Deutscher Nimec'kij Kanal Sub-Series](#) has six editions of the *Deutscher Nimec'kij Kanal*. All of the editions are from 1994, and they are in German and Russian.

The [Clippings Sub-Series](#) is comprised of articles that Poppke cut out of many different newspapers. They vary from topics on the Germans from Russia to other articles Poppke was interested in. The sub-series is in alphabetical order.

The [Wandering Volhynians Series](#) contains information relating to the Wandering Volhynians publication. Poppke collected many materials on this topic, enough to warrant its own series. The series is in English and German and has been organized into alphabetical order.

Another small series in the collection is the [Folklore Series](#). The contents of the series include folk medicine, sayings, and customs relating to the Germans from Russia.

The [Genealogy Series](#) consists of general genealogical information and genealogy research conducted by Poppke. The series has been organized into alphabetical order.

The [Food Series](#) includes information on cookbooks and food, and it also contains recipes.

The [Photograph Series](#) contains seventy-three photographs. The dates of the photographs include: 1976, 1985, 1993, and 1997. Some of the photographs are of Poppke, but the majority of them are from Poppke's journey through the Ukraine in 1993. Some of the photographs have been used for Poppke's Photo Journals and have been placed on the Germans from Russia Heritage Society website, but there were also many photographs that were not used or published.

Reoccurring people in the photographs include: Herb Poppke, Sergei Kaspirezny (Poppke's translator), Andrei Kononyenko (Poppke's driver), Oksana (Andrei's wife), Kostya (Poppke's travel agent/ translator), Victoria (Kostya's wife), and Ruslan Kondratuk (archivist).

The organization of the photographs has been based on the order in which they appeared in Poppke's Photo Journals, with the exception of the first three photographs and the last one. Poppke's journey included four main areas which resulted in four albums: Glückstal, Shitomir, Teplitz, and Grossliebental.

The [Copies of Selected Materials Series](#) contains excerpts as well as typed and copied versions of articles, papers, and books. Some of the series has been organized by the title of the work and others by the author or subject. The series has been arranged alphabetically.

The [Music Series](#) is comprised of sheet music, songs and carols, and phonograph records.

The [Sheet Music Sub-Series](#) has German Russian sheet music for songs and carols.

The [Phonograph Records Sub-Series](#) has sixteen phonograph records, consisting mainly of polkas and German music. The order of was based on the numbering system already established by Poppke.

Another large series in the collection is the [Audio Tapes Series](#). The series contains 125 cassette tapes collected and created by Poppke. The series has been organized into fourteen groupings: Music, German and Russian Languages, Miscellaneous, 1988 AHSGR Milwaukee Convention, 1986 AHSGR Oklahoma City Convention, 1983 AHSGR Lincoln Convention, 1982 AHSGR Wichita Convention, 1978 AHSGR 10th Anniversary Lincoln Convention, 1977 NDHSGR Bismarck Convention, 1976 AHSGR Denver Convention, 1975 AHSGR Denver Picnic, 1975 AHSGR Lincoln Convention, Germans from Russia Heritage Society, and Other.

The [Subject Series](#) consists mainly of miscellaneous items that did not directly relate to any other series. The contents of the series were organized by subject and have been placed in alphabetical order.

SEPARATION RECORD

Donated along with the Herb Poppke Collection was many books and publications relating to the Germans from Russia. These items have been cataloged and placed within the GRHC Library.
