Burleigh F. Spalding was a lawyer, U.S. representative from North Dakota, and judge, from Fargo, N.D.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

Reminiscences (73 p., 1924) chiefly relating to North Dakota politics and Spalding's activities as U.S. representative (1899-1901, 1903-1905), with the state Republican Party, and as North Dakota Supreme Court judge (1907-1914), as dictated to Mary Nowatzki; donor correspondence; and newspaper clippings.
