HISTORY

Born at Hallingdal, Norway, son of Endre Swenson and Margit Torseth. Immigrated in 1874 to Kenyon, Minn., moved to N.D. in 1875. Wed Ingeborg Brujord in 1882. He was elected to N.D. House of Representatives in 1911. He died at Kindred, N.D.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

Typed copy of his reminiscence concerning his childhood home in Norway and early years in Kindred, N.D. Includes mention of his education in Norway, his cattle buying job in Norway, immigrating to the U.S., working as a hired man for other Norwegian settlers, a bout of typhoid fever, early settlers around

Kindred, N.D. and on the Sheyenne and Wild Rice Rivers, brief mention of James Hill, and the Norman Lutheran Church.
