

PLANTS - Shorter Roots - Green Roofs

Gramma Grass



- Grows up to 18 inches tall
- Drought Resistant
- Leaves up to 10 inches long

Blue Stem Grass



- Short grass
- Mixes well with other grasses
- Usually not more than 3 feet tall
- Valuable for erosion control

Prairie Cordgrass



- Otherwise known as "switch-grass"
- Coarse; not good for grazing
- Likes water
- Good for erosion control

Equisetum



- 2 to 3 feet in height
- Up to 1 inch in diameter
- Looks much like bamboo

Fescue Grass



- Your every-day normal grass
- Growth in both warm and cold zones
- Extremely drought-resistant

Kentucky Bluegrass



- Considered invasive
- 18 to 24 inches tall
- Leaf blades about 3 to 4 inches long
- Root growth tempermental;
dependent on temperature

PLANTS - Longer Roots - Prairie Restoration

Yellow Lady Slipper



- Bogs & shady swamps for habitat
- Petal can be 1 to 2 inches long
- 18 to 24 inches in height

Wild Tiger Lily



- Flowers grow up to 3 inches in width
- Strong, sweet smell
- Edible
- Some medicinal use

Indian Grass



- 3 to 8 feet in height
- Great for live-stock grazing
- Broad blue-green blades on top

Brome Grass



- 2 to 4 feet in height
- Drought Resistant
- Sometimes considered invasive
