## State Livestock Population Drops'

The overall livestock population on North Dakota farms was smaller on January 1, 1950, than a year earlier. January 1 inventory numbers of poultry were higher this year.

The downward trend for most species of livestock started during 1944 and has continued each year through 1949. Hog numbers were up on January 1, 1949, but slipped again this year. This is partially explained by earlier marketings of spring-farrowed pigs during the last months of 1949. Total numbers of all cattle and calves dropped one per cent during 1949, from 1,558,000 at the beginning of the year to 1,542,000 head at the end of the year.

However, milk cows showed a gain in numbers. On January 1, 1949, there were an estimated 417,000 head on North Dakota farms but by January 1, 1950, the milk cow population had increased one per cent to 421,000 head. This is the first upturn in milk cow numbers since 1944.

Stock sheep numbers at 346,000 head were down nine per cent from a year carlier. This is the smallest January 1 number of sheep on hand since 1925. Horse numbers continue to dwindle. On January 1 this year 153,000 were on hand in the state. This is the smallest number since 1891.

More poultry was on North Dakota farms at the beginning of this year than on January 1, 1949. Chicken numbers were up eight per cent to 4,872,000 birds. Turkey numbers at 44,000 were up ten per cent but still comprised only a small fraction of the 1939-48 average of 218,000 birds.

The total inventory value of all livestock on North Dakota farms January 1, 1950, was eleven per cent below that of January 1, 1949. It amounted to 234 million dollars at the beginning of 1950 compared with 264 million at the beginning of 1949. The lower value was due both to smaller inventory numbers and lower values per head.
