# Prices of North Dakota Farm Products

Farm prices of North Dakota farm products on October 15, 1955, were about the same as compared to the previous month but lower than a year earlier.

The North Dakota all-commodity farm price index for October 15 was a point higher than a month earlier but 15 points lower than a year earlier. The October 15 farm price index for grains was up a point for the month but down 16 points for the year. The North Dakota meat animals index was down five points for the month and down 30 points for the year, while the dairy farm price index was up three points for both the month and the year. The farm price index for poultry and eggs was up seven points for the month and up 39 points for the year ending October 15, 1955.

October 15 farm prices, compared to the previous month's prices, showed nine commodities with price increases, seven commodities with price decreases and five commodities with prices unchanged. In comparison to the previous year, six commodities had price increases and 15 commodities had price declines. The commodities with price increases for the year included calves, retail milk, butterfat, chickens, turkeys and eggs.

The North Dakota farm price changes for the month ending October 15, 1955, were: oats and barley up two cents; rye up seven cents; flax and eggs up three cents, potatoes up 15 cents; calves up 80 cents; wholesale milk up five cents; and butterfat up one cent. For the same period corn was down 15 cents; hogs down 70 cents; milk cows down $\$ 10$ per head; and wool down two cents. The price of all-wheat, sweet clover seed, retail milk, chickens and turkeys remained unchanged for this period, September 15 to October 15.

The price of hogs was $\$ 17.50$ on October 15, 1954, and on October 15,1955 the price was $\$ 13.70$, a decline of $\$ 3.80$ for the year. The October decline makes that the seventeenth month that the price has been downward. The hog price trend started downward in May, 1954, after reaching a top of $\$ 25.80$ per hundred weight.
