# Prices of North Dakota Farm Products

The North Dakota all-commodity farm price index for April 15, 1956 was 231 which is seven points higher than a month earlier but six points lower than the index of a year ago. Eleven of the 20 commodities reported in the accompanying table show a higher price for the month, three show no change, and six show a lower farm price.

All of the crops included in this report show a higher farm price for the month except that oats were down one cent and alfalfa seed down \$1. Beef cattle were up 90 cents for the month, hogs were up \$1.50, milk cows were up \$5, but calves were down 20 cents and lambs down 30 cents. Wholesale milk and the retail milk farm price show no change for the month. Butterfat was up one cent for the month. Eggs also show no change for the month but the farm price of chickens and turkeys was down one cent.
