BIOGRAPHY

Ella M. Fetcher was born at Enderlin, N.D. in 1894. She graduated from Valley City State College (N.D.) and taught school in Jamestown, N.D. for many years, retiring as principal of the Roosevelt School there. She also operated a private kindergarten in Jamestown. She died in Fargo in 1979.
