
Annual Staff Development Workshop

A team of broadly skilled, dedicated, upbeat staff is helping NDSU students discover that "being a student has never been easier!"

"This is a good bunch of folks," says Wendy Clarin, Manager of Bison Connection, NDSU's newest one-stop service center located on the main level of the Memorial Union. "We're very lucky," adds Wendy.

These seven friendly faces come to this unique student service team from a variety of on- and off-campus

backgrounds. "I really enjoy the family atmosphere here at NDSU," says Tanie Boeddeker, a recent NDSU graduate. "No day is the same," observes Linda Murphy. She and Kari Fischer moved over from Customer Account Services. "We get to see a lot of students." adds Kari.

Five weeks prior to the beginning of the fall semester, the team members were cross-trained in three student service areas: Registration and Records, Student Financial Services and Customer Account Services. As frontline staff committed to one-on-one personal service, they assist students with a long list of items including major changes, filing the FAFSA and processing withdrawals.



Spring 2008 will be the team's first full semester in the Memorial Union location. The site currently offers four permanent stations, two express stations and a student self-serve kiosk. Hours are Monday through Friday, 7:00 am to 9:00 pm; Saturday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and Sunday, noon to 4:00 pm. In addition, a 24-hour online service is available at www.ndsu.edu/bisonconnection.

The concept for the Bison Connection started with former Vice President for Student Affairs George Wallman. A task force was formed to explore functions and physical designs, resulting in ideas modeled after University of Minnesota, Mankato and University of Minnesota (Twin Cities).

Bison Connection staff members encourage departmental units to direct students to the Bison Connection as the first point of contact for services.

The campus community is invited to the Grand Opening/ Open House January 30-31. A ribbon cutting ceremony, refreshments and door prizes will be held at 3:00 pm on Wednesday.

"What is 'sustainability,' and what does it mean for NDSU?" This past fall, Staff Senate initiated a campus-wide task force to look into what it means to be a sustainable campus and to develop a list of action recommendations to present to President Chapman.

An invitation to participate on the task force was extended to staff via email, to students through Student Government and to faculty through University Senate. Forty-five staff, students and faculty have joined.

The first meeting was held December 7. Al Brewer, who works closely with the MSUM Sustainability Campus Initiative, was the guest speaker.

Sustainability has often been defined as

"meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs" (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/ Brundtland_Commission).

Sustainability takes into consideration environmental, social justice and economic concerns. It asks basic questions about collective human impact on the ecological systems and services on which we depend for our existence, and the rights of future generations to those same systems and services.
