





Taking check on the progress of the A.C. Book Store are Mangus Geston and Don Schreder. The Book Store expects to open after Christmas vacation.



Personality of the Year . . .

Meet Dale Brostrom, Director of the Student Union

"Man of the year for NDAC." That is quite an honor for anyone, and when Dale Brostrom, director of the Student Union was informed that he was the one, his only comment was a surprised, "Gosh."

Dale Brostrom, has been associated with North Dakota State ever since he came out of service in 1946 after three years in the Navy during World War II.

During his three years as student at the college, Dale received a degree in Arts and Science with a major in economics. He was very active while in school.

Brostrom was a member of Theta Chi fraternity, lettered for two years on the varsity basketball team, was on the freshman team, belonged to the Lettermen's Club, took part in the Student government, was secretary of the Athletic Board of Control, and found enough time to work part-time and get married. Kind of a full career.

A short rundown on Dale's life shows him to have been a resident of North Dakota all of his life except for his hitch in the navy.

Dale Brostrom was born May 19, 1926 near Bismarck, North Dakota. For the first years of his life he

lived on a farm and attended sixth grade, the family moved to country school. Then after the Washburn, where Dale was a

member of the basketball team in his sophomore year.

When he was a junior in high school, the Brostrom family moved back to Bismarck and for two years, Dale was a member of the high school basketball team where he played center.

While still in high school, Dale enlisted in the US Navy, but he was allowed to finish school under the plan then in effect. After graduation he was sent to boot training at Farragut, Idaho.

Upon completion of his boot training, Dale attended radio school at Idaho University, and from there he was sent to the Pacific. For two years he served on a destroyer in combat. Finally, in 1945, Dale was sent to the Hawaiian Island, where he was stationed until his discharge in May, 1946.

Upon his discharge from service, Dale came to the college and began upon his career at State.

In his student days, Dale worked part-time at the college bookstore. Upon graduation, this became a full-time job. He worked in the bookstore until July 1950, when he became executive secretary of the alumni association, a post he held until July, 1952.

In July, 1952, Dale took over a position in the library. This July he became director of the Student Union building. Prior to this, he served as secretary of the Student Union Board from 1951-53.

At present he is still manager of the Men's Dorm, where he lives with his wife, the former Fern Immerman, also an ex-student at State and a member of Kappa

Alpha Theta sorority, and their four year old daughter. They were married in 1948.

Just what does the job of student union director consist of you may wonder? A little bit of everything, is the way that Dale describes it.

He is in charge of the building from one end to the other. From paying the help, to making sure that the building is clean is Dale's job. He books the ballroom for the use of various organizations, and also rations out the conference rooms for various school organizations.

In addition he is the sounding board for beefs and ideas from every person on campus or off who has some idea or scheme for the building.

Just how busy being manager of the Union keeps Dale may be judged from this fact. When he took over the director's job, he gave up his activities in all downtown organizations. At present, his only relaxation is playing for the VFW basketball team in the Fargo Commercial League.

His job keeps him busy from early morning until late at night six and seven days a week, vacation periods included. Dale is on hand soon after the Union opens every morning, and he is also around at lock-up time. Quite a busy schedule.

Our hats off to Dale Brostrom, NDAC alum and friend of the college, who keeps our new Union running smoothly so that we all may enjoy it. He is truly qualified to be our man of the year. . .


The Theta Chi's, like other fraternities and sororities, gave an annual Christmas party to a group of children from local orphanages.




Queen Joyce Swenson with her attendants, Gail Fitzloff and Carol Jordheim, watched the parade from a convertible.














