BIOGRAPHY

The town of Grafton, North Dakota began in 1881 when the railroad was built through Walsh County. In that same year, Grafton was also designated as the county seat. The city was settled mostly by those coming to the area from Grafton County, New Hampshire, to which Grafton owes its name.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

James Loos compiled data from the 1885 Dakota Territory census on Grafton, North Dakota and extrapolated data from it to look at the town as a whole but also the residents themselves and Walsh County.
