BIOGRAPHY

Sebastian Lester Vogel was born July 10, 1918 in Fargo, North Dakota to Sebastian O. and Rose G (Schluch) Vogel. He graduated from North Dakota Agricultural College in 1946. He served in the Army Air Corp during World War II on a B-17 as a radio operator. He was shot down over France, escaped with the help of the French underground, and awarded both the Purple Heart and an air medal. He would go on to marry Kathlee Chezick on June 11, 1943 in Fargo, North Dakota. He taught agricultural engineering at North Dakota State University for 25 years and then taught at Independent Study. He and Kathleen had seven children.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This small collection continues a recounting of several events that happened to during World War II. It also includes a copy of a telegram from the military listening him as alive rather than missing in action and a letter on him receiving his medals.
