# RESOLUTIONS NATIONAL WOMAN'S CHRISTIAN TEMPERANCE UNION Anaheim, California

August 18-22, 1988

We, the members of the National Woman's Christian Temperance Union, meeting in the Inn at the Park, Anaheim, California, for 114th annual convention, August 18-22, 1988, thank and praise our God who has shown His mercies to each one of us this past year. We still hold to the values of total abstinence for the individual and prohibition for our nation. We continue support for any measures of pro-family or pro-moral nature that will ensure a safer and happier way of life for our children. We believe with Christ as our Cornerstone, our building efforts will not be in vain.

Therefore, be it resolved:

CHURCHES

We commend these denominations which are promoting the total abstinence way of life in their doctrine and teaching. We, therefore, urge all church members to rededicate themselves to a life of total abstinence in the home, as well as in their business and social functions.

SCHOOLS

We continue to believe that education is of extreme importance to every child, regardless of age. It is important that each one know the reason behind their decision to say NO to all substances that impair the mind and body. Present to all school administrators free samples of literature including a Signal Press catalog and the opportunity to preview films. We urge each state to consider sponsoring a narcotic education workshop.

PORNOGRAPHY

Dial-a-porn has recently become a major profitmaking venture for producers and telephone companies. Many concerned citizens have worked to removed such filth from the telephone lines to little avail. We urge each member to contact her state legislators to control this problem in their state.

LEGISLATION

In view of the great need in legislative matters we urge our representatives and senators to support the Health and Warning Label bills HR 4441 and S 2047. Since federal excise taxes on beer and wine were last raised in 1951, we recommend higher taxes on alcoholic beverages at this time which would help to reduce the federal budget deficit.

Furthermore, since alcohol is such a health problem, we strongly request that alcoholic beverages be regulated by the Department of Health and Human Services rather than the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE -- 1988

We thank God for supplying all of our needs through the many members and friends who have supported and continue to support the work of the National WCTU. It is your faithfulness through prayers, service and gifts that makes the work possible.

In order that the basic needs of the organization be met and the recommended projects be implemented, we urge each treasurer to submit whatever funds have been received on a regular basis

(at least quarterly).

The Financial Committee makes the following recommendations for the year 1988-89.

1. \$50,000 Club

In light of the fact that the National WCTU is invited to have a literature exhibit at as many as eight national educational organizations' annual meetings, and with the cost of having an exhibit being at least \$1,000 each, we recommend that unions and members continue their support of the \$50,000 Club so that this opportunity to reach educators and school administrators and made available to them at first-hand the educational materials produced by Signal Press may be continued. We urge each of the unions or individuals who are able to contribute a sum of \$2.00 for the express purpose of creating new films or filmstrips and printing new materials.

2. 3 P's Fund (Paint, Preserve & Protect)

We recognize the importance of maintaining WCTU owned homes and buildings in Evanston, IL. Therefore, we recommend the continuation of the 3 P's Fund so that we may paint, preserve and protect our property. We recommend the state

unions promote and support this fund.
