This is of special importance to WCTU members to let you know what happened on bills our ladies were involved in.

## VICTORIES

- HB 1352 Prohibits use of steroids for people.

  Passed.
- HB 1419 Obscentiy and pornography age increased from child to minor. Passed.
- HB 1421 Legalizes home schooling with weekly checks by certified teacher. Passed.
- HB 1642 Prohibits aborted fetal organs to be used.
- Passed.
  SB 2502 Seizure of vehicles after alcohol-related violations, Passed.
- SB 2440 Limits age for bingo. Passed
- HB 1254 Closes teachers' files. Vetoed by Governor after it was passed by legislature.
- HB 1406 Gambling to include gaming wheels (roulette). Defeated.
- HB 1423 Sale of liquor on Good Friday. Defeated.
- SB 2300 Sale of liquor New Year's Eve if on Sunday. Defeated.
- SB 2397 SUNDAY OPENING OF RETAIL AND LIQUOR STORES. DEFEATED. PRAISE THE LORD!!!

## DEFEATS

- HB 1383 Prohibited designated smoking area in grade or high school. Defeated.
- HB 1469 Suspends driver's license of underage drinking driver. Defeated.
- HB 1535 Prohibited school-based clinics. Defeated
- HB 1643 Anti-abortion bill Defeated.
- HB 1647 Teach chastity in sex education. Defeated.
- SB 2238 Take drivers' license from drinking driver under 21 years old. Defeated.
- SB 2369 Prohibited operating boat under influence of alcohol or drugs. Defeated.
- SB 2385 Prohibited alcoholic beverages in state school dorms. Defeated.
- HB 1184 Off-track betting on horse racing. Passed Increases blackjack betting from \$2. to \$5. Passed.

- HB 1292 Extends gambling to calcuttas. Passed. HB 1562 Sale of liquor on Sundays for "events".
- Passed.

  HB 1604 School based health education course.
- HB 1604 School based health education course Passed.
- HB 1641 Electronic games for gambling. Passed. (Plan to have this referred to voters.)
- SB 2400 Sale of liquor one hour longer to 1 a.m.
  Thanksgiving and Good Friday eves.
  Passed.
- SB 2402 Those under 21 years of age dispense alcoholic beverages. Passed.
- SB 2408 Increase to over 6 employees on Sundays in grocery stores. Passed.

In 1987 our victories and defeats were 50-50 percent; this year it's 11-17. 39.2 percent - 60.8 percent. Let us continue to overcome evil with good and to let Jesus' love shine! God bless you as you follow Him and serve others in His strength.

August 29-31, 1989
