The state convention plans will be made then.


Come one, caome all to help us.

Samuel Triebwasser

Samuel Triebwasser, 90, of Minot, died Tuesday, February 26, 1991 in a Minot Hospital. His funeral was held March 1 in the Assembly of God Church, Minot, with burial in the Sawyer Community Ceme-

tery.

He was born July 1, 1900, in Lincoln Valley, ND, to Emanuel and Christina Triebwasser. He was reared on a farm near Lincoln Valley and attended schools in that area. He married Christina Vix March 26, 1922, in Sawyer. They made their home on a farm near there and he was employed at the Vix Coal Mines near Sawyer. She died July 7, 1943. He married Mina Nokleby April 12, 1947, in Minot. They made their home in Minot and he was employed by Greslivold Truck Lines. At that time of his retirement during the mid 1960's he was self-employed as a carpenter.

He was a member of the First Assembly of God Church, the Senior Citizens Bible Study Group, and an Honorary Member of the Woman's Christian

Union.

Survivors include his wife, a granddaughter, and two great grandsons. The Thomas Funeral Home of Minot was in charge of the funeral arrangements.
