Nettie "Jennie" Dance, 90, died April 8, 1991. She was born August 11, 1900, at Parker, SD. She served as postmaster at Menoken from 1935-1970, when she retired. At age 70 she became a missionary's helper in Kenya, Africa, and in Sao Paulo. Brazil.

Nettie taught school near Menoken. She married Alvin Cecil Dance Dec. 23, 1923, at Bismarck. She was active in Child Evangelism Fellowship, Women's Christian Temperence Union and Menoken Community Church. She entered Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center in 1986. Mr. Dance died in 1950.
