The History and Context of Yemen

- ❑ Proxy war between Saudi-led coalition and Houthi rebels
- ❑ Devastating impact on the country's infrastructure, economy, and people





Site selection

Aden, Yemen: A Historical Beacon

- ❑ Aden's historical role as a cultural and commercial hub in "Arabia Felix."
- ❑ Strategic location at the crossroads of major maritime routes.
- ❑ Rich history of cultural exchange and diversity.
- ❑ Current challenges include political instability and conflict.
- ❑ Potential for architecture to restore its historical cosmopolitanism



Modern Islamic Architecture: A Vehicle for Unity

Case Study: West Kowloon Cultural District

- Located in Hong Kong, faced challenges in planning due to limited public participation
- Project suspended in 2006, restarted with a statutory-body development approach
- Construction began in 2013, enhancing area's permeability and connectivity
- Emphasizes cultural significance and diverse stakeholder engagement
- Lessons on importance of inclusive planning and community involvement





Case Study: District Cultural Square

- Located adjacent to traditional temples in Hong Kong
- Venue for theatrical events, parades, and traditional performances
- Main stage design inspired by local opera headdress
- Enhances area's permeability and connectivity, revitalizing the waterfront
- Demonstrates how architecture can revitalize traditional culture

Case Study: Shenzhen Cultural District

- Focuses on the Nantou Ancient City, an urbanized village with rich history
- Underwent urban renewal to enhance public satisfaction
- Considered accessibility, lighting, aesthetics, and public space quality
- Aims to display Shenzhen's original culture and promote public participation
- Balances preservation with modernization



Case Study: Saadiyat Island Cultural District

- Mixed-use development in Abu Dhabi, UAE
- Features residential areas, retail spaces, and the landmark Gastrodome
- Waterfront edge activated by shops and cafes
- Focus on high-end residential units and vibrant public spaces
- Demonstrates integration of cultural and commercial elements

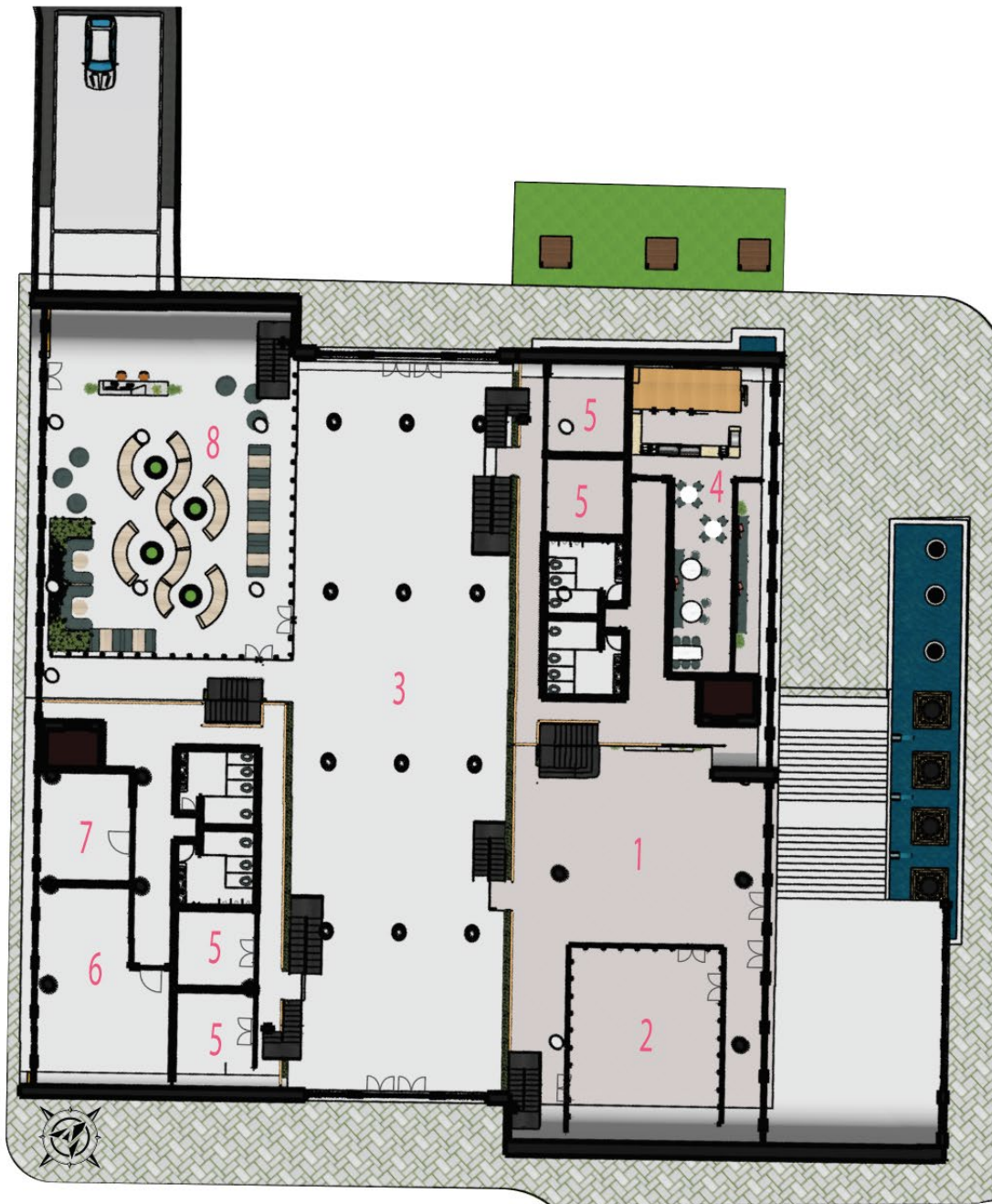

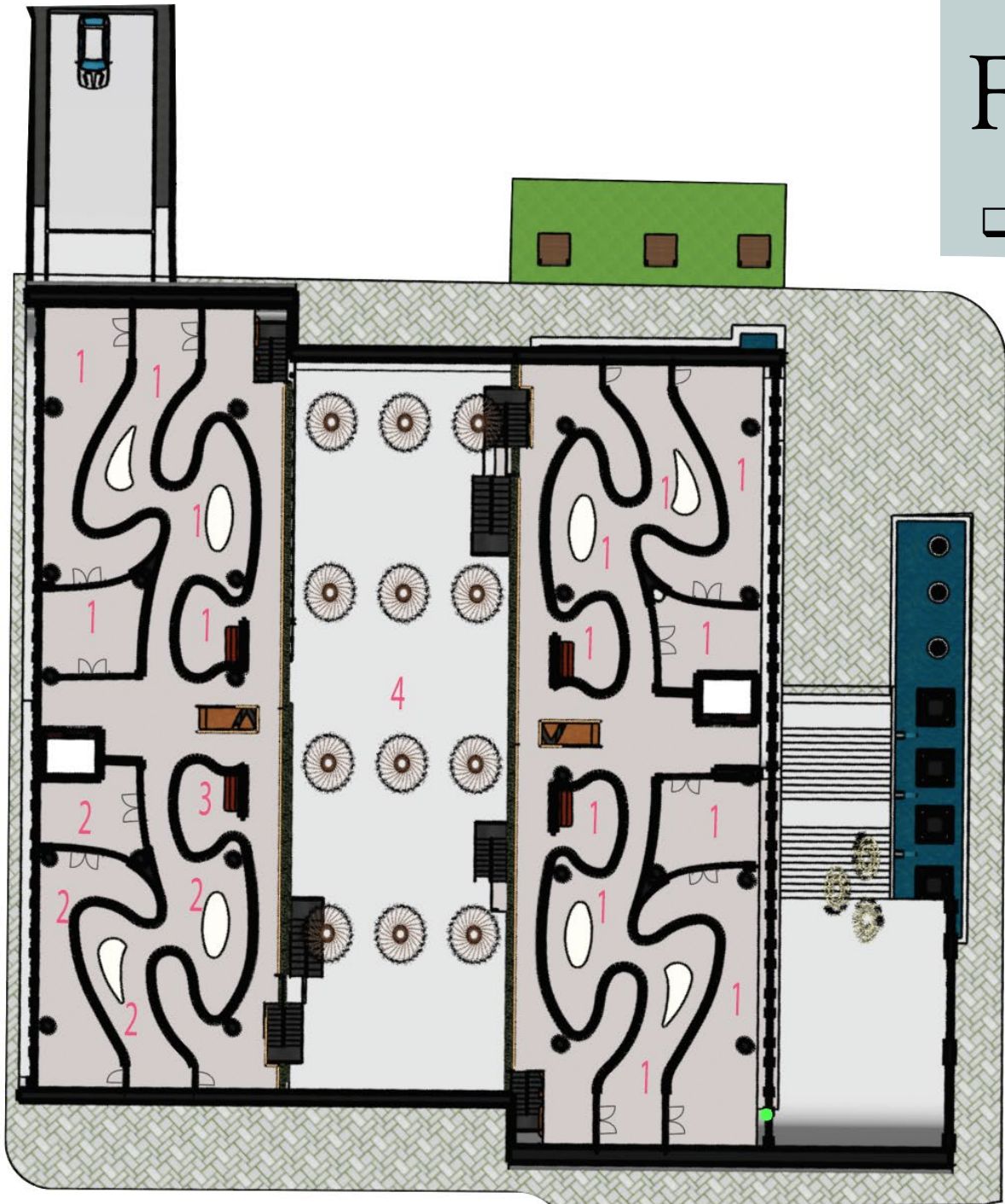

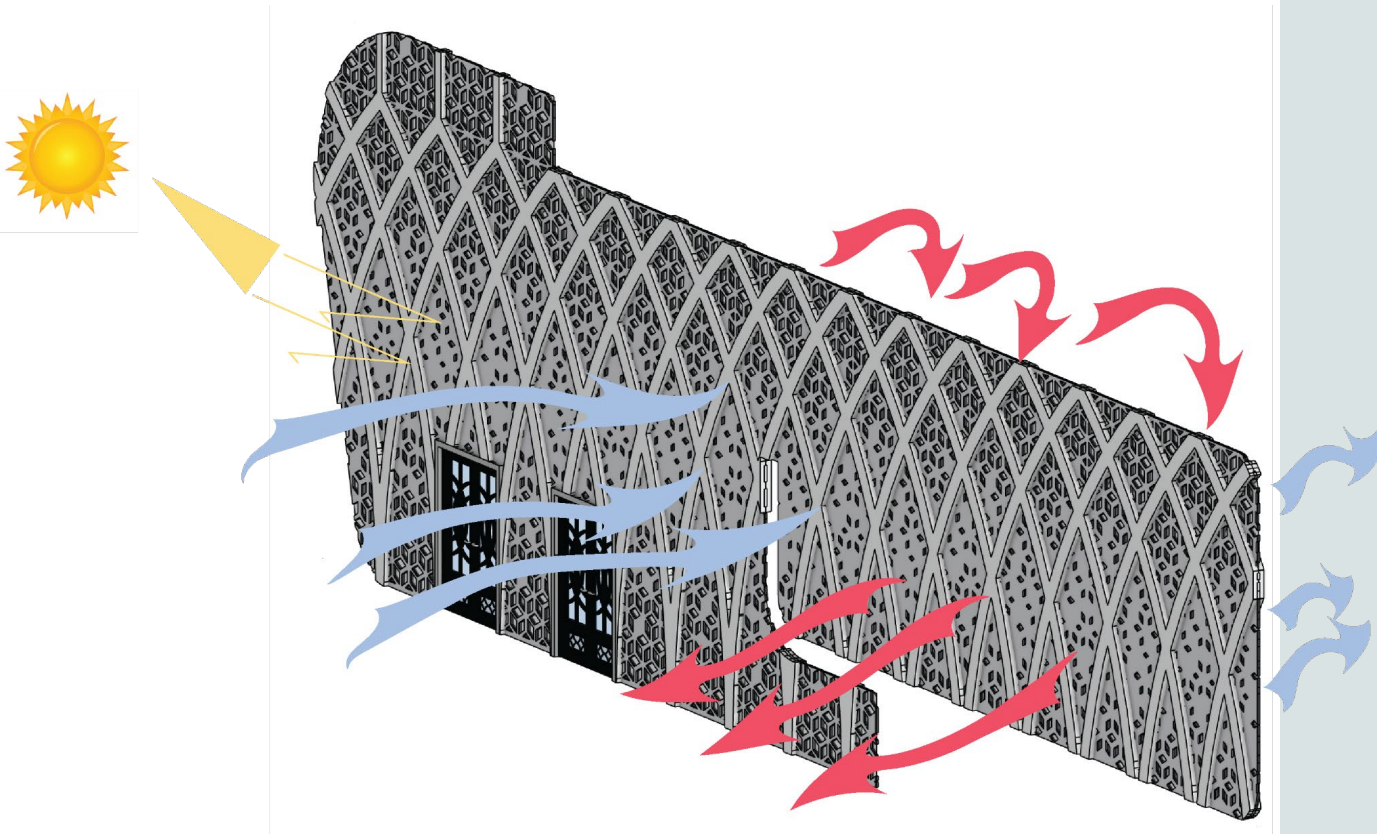

Perforated wall



- ❑ Perforated walls allow natural light to filter into the Cultural Spaces
- ❑ Perforation patterns inspired by traditional Islamic architecture
- ❑ Intricate designs create a play of light and shadow, enhancing the ambiance
- ❑ Perforations provide natural ventilation, reducing the need for artificial cooling





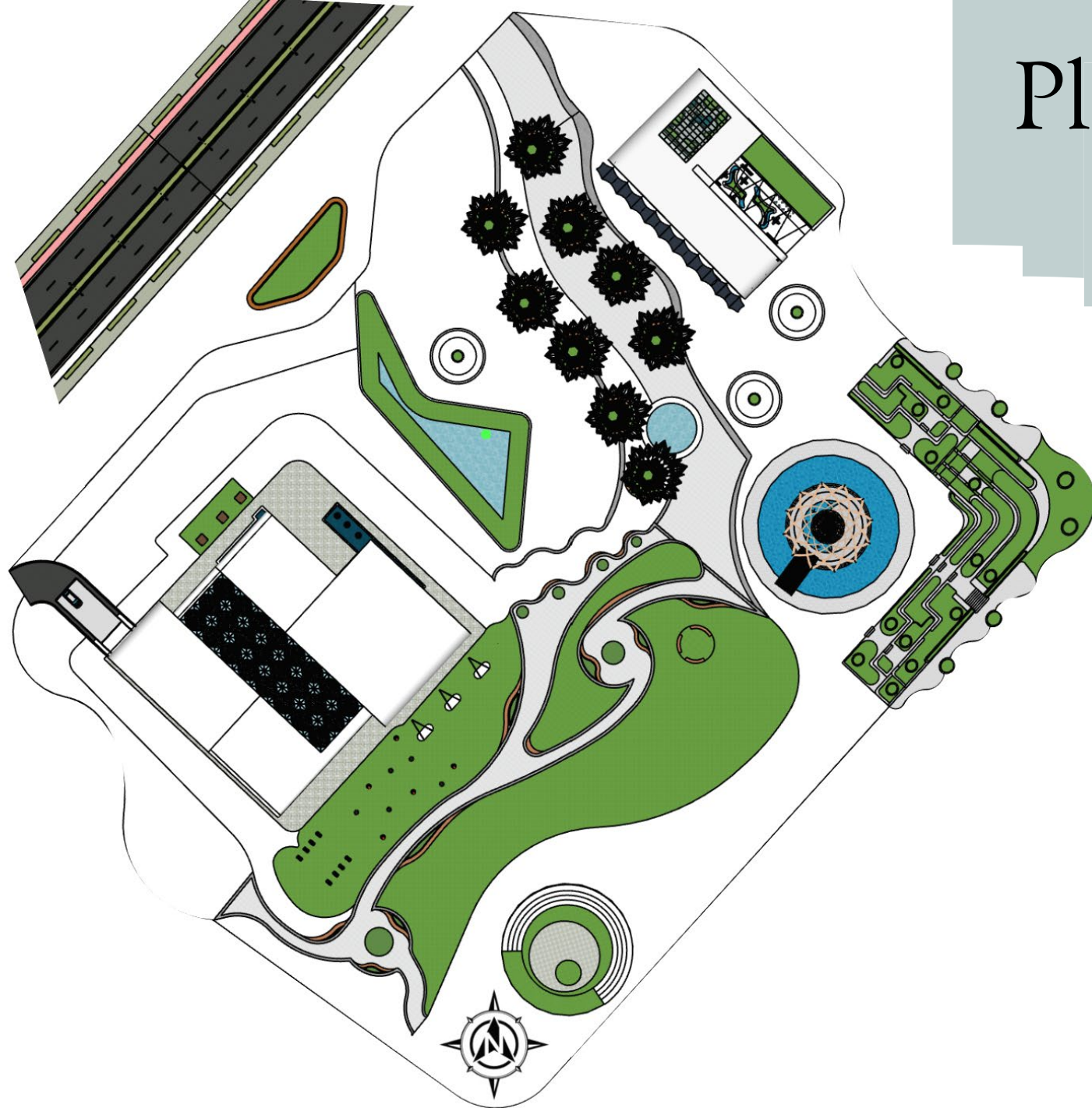






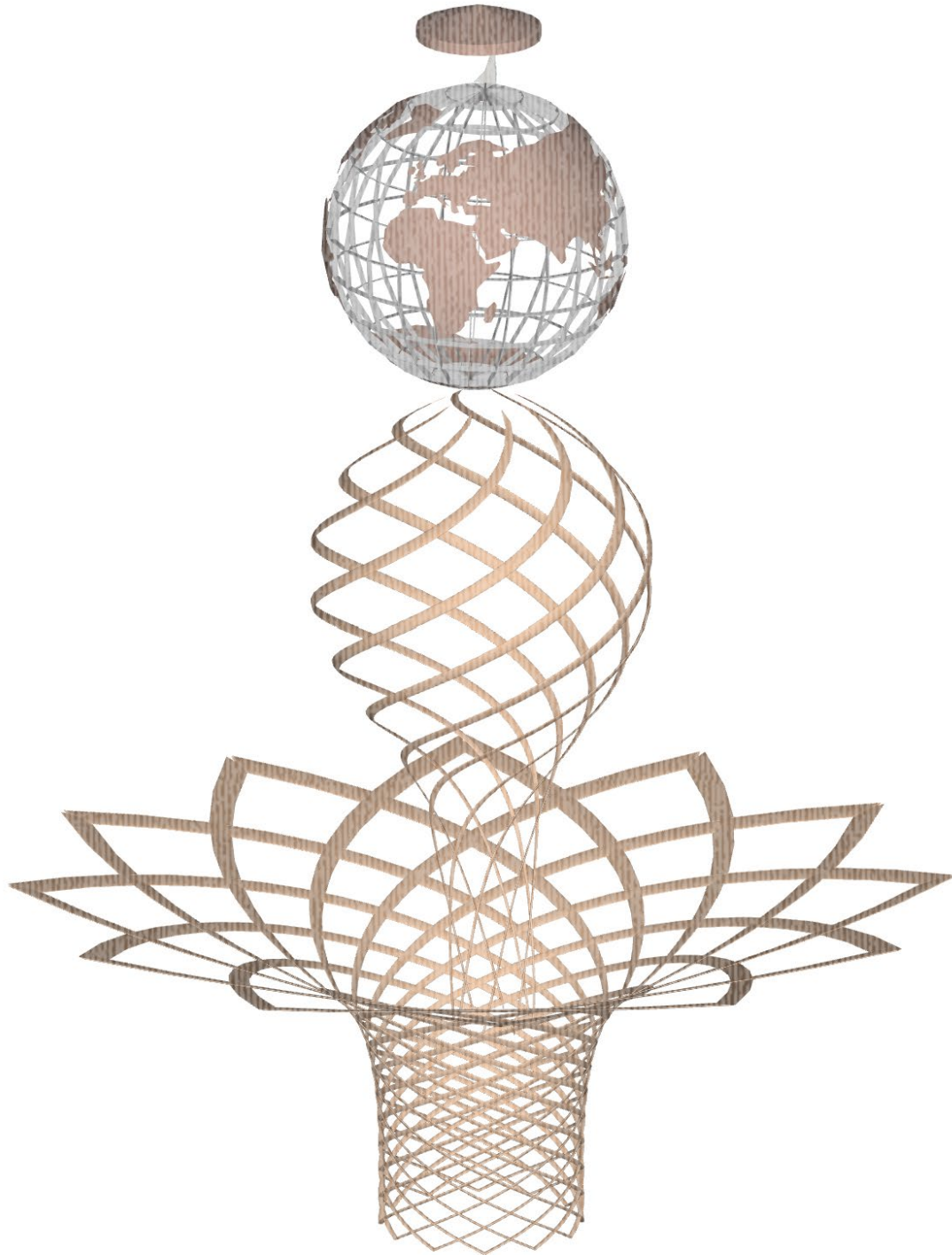

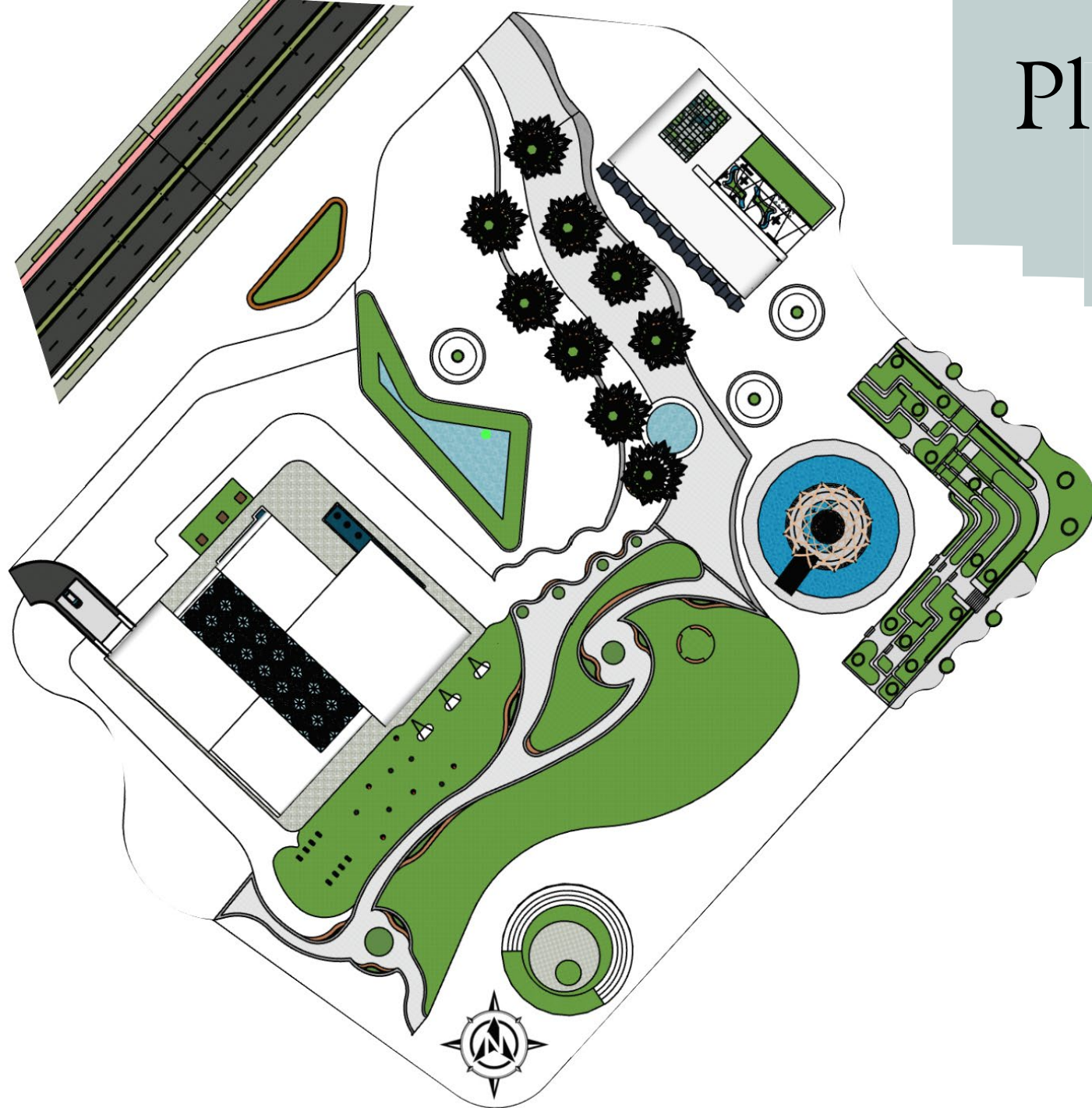


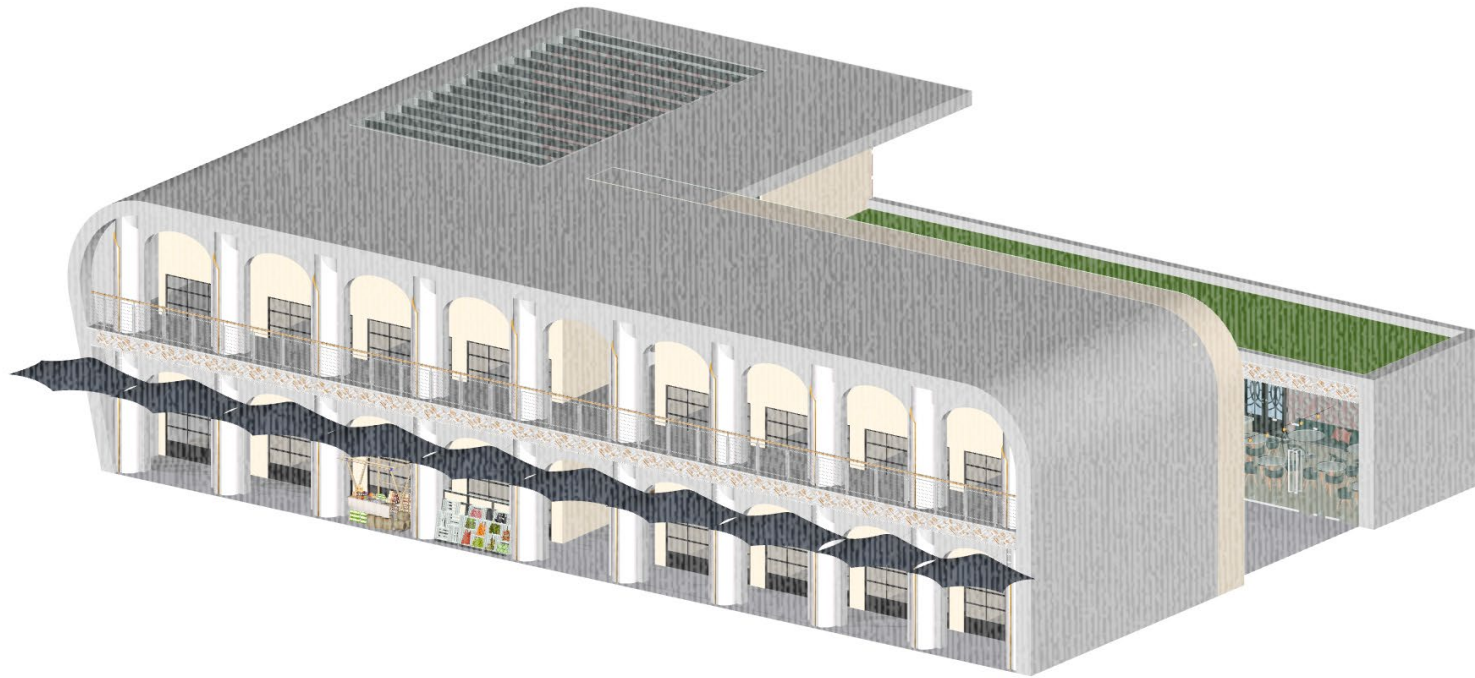
Unity Plaza: A Unifying Focal Point and Gathering Space

- ❑ Inspired by the lotus flower, a symbol of purity and enlightenment in many cultures
- ❑ Petals of the lotus flower form the iconic structure, representing the diversity of cultures
- ❑ A world globe is held up from the center of the structure, symbolizing unity and interconnectedness
- ❑ Lighting features that change colors to symbolize cultural celebrations
- ❑ Open amphitheater design with tiered seating for community gatherings
- ❑ Central stage for performances, including traditional music, and dance.

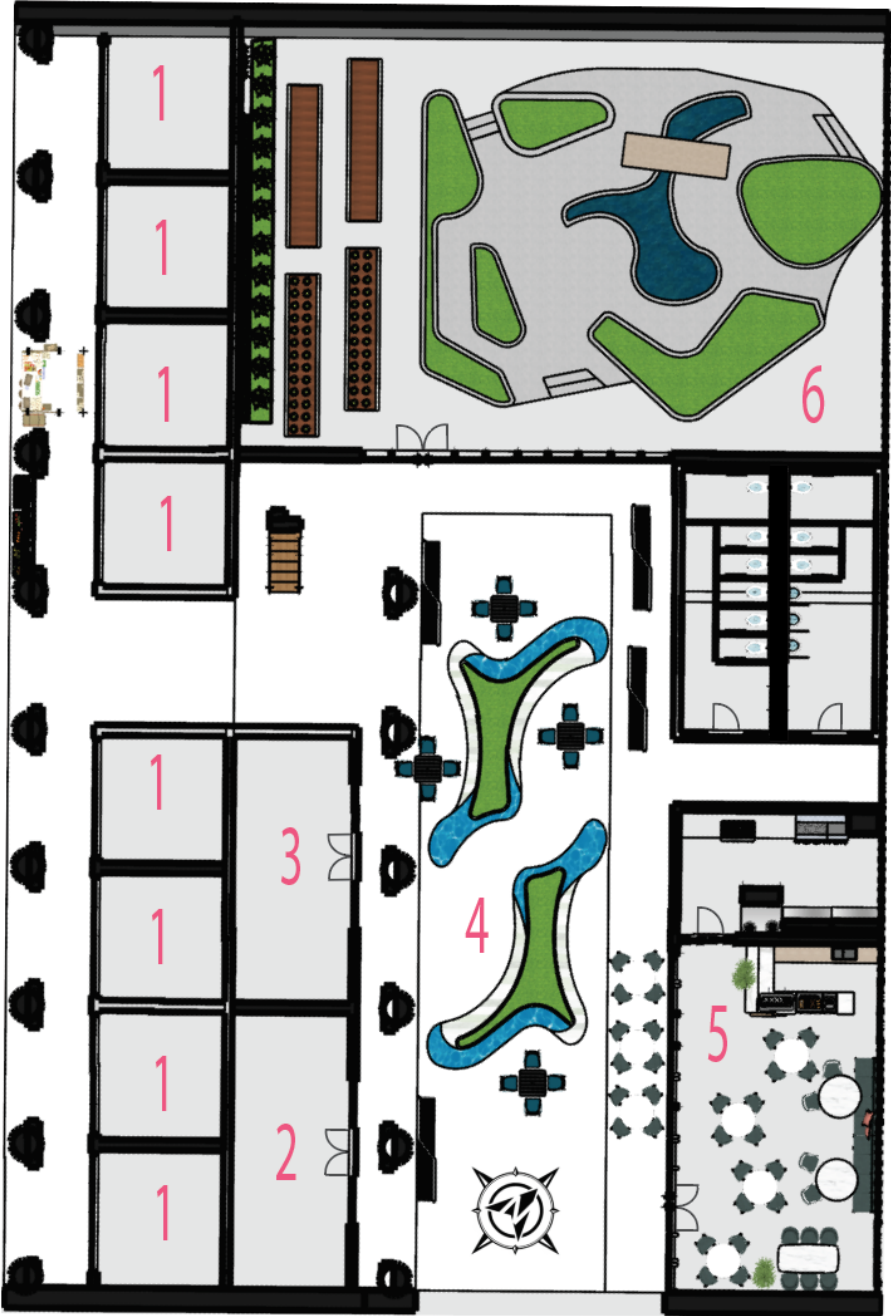




Souk: A Yemeni Street Market
